Arthroscopy is an essential tool in modern-day Orthopaedics and forms part of the contemporary focus on minimally invasive techniques in surgery. One of the challenges has always been in training, as the techniques of visualisation and instrumentation within the small cavity of an ankle or foot joint are quite different from those in the more capacious knee or shoulder. Foot and Ankle arthroscopy is also a less commonly performed procedure than arthroscopy of the shoulder and knee, and there is a wealth of evidence to show that exposure during training is far less. Apprenticeship style training often needs to be supplemented with some focused instruction such as offered on these courses. Frequently this kind of refresher training is also invaluable in the early years of consultant life and beyond, particularly when adopting new techniques.
